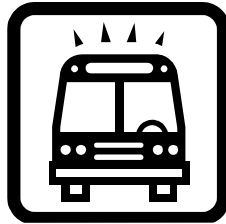

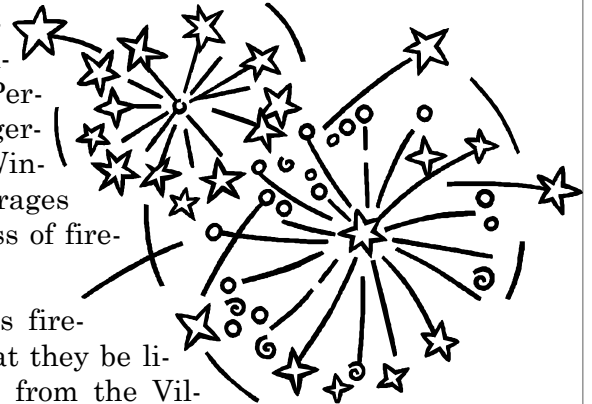
Stay Safe and Leave Fireworks to the Pros!

With summer holidays and celebrations comes fireworks displays sponsored by many local communities. Personal or private fireworks can be dangerous, and quite possibly deadly. The Winthrop Harbor Fire Department encourages all Village residents to leave any class of fireworks to the professionals.

Our Village Ordinance 93.10 governs fireworks in the Village and requires that they be licensed and permitted by permission from the Village Board. The Fire Department fully supports this ordinance, because injuries are only a part of the problem.

Last year U.S. fire departments were called to some 36,900 fires started by fireworks. Those fires caused property damage totaling \$25 million. And, yes, people do die from fireworks related injuries and from fires which were started by fireworks.

Does legal mean safe? Don't think that fireworks are safe just because they're legal in your State. The largest share of fireworks injuries are caused by Class C fireworks, the kind that are legal in many States, and the kind sold over the counter in many stores throughout Illinois. For these reasons, those of us who

Bicycle Registration Program



Once you've finished assembling that brand new bicycle, take a moment to jot down the serial number. For only \$1, you can register your bicycle with the Police Department for a permanent record of ownership. With this information on file, the Police Department can accurately report the serial number of stolen bicycles to surrounding police agencies. When a bicycle is found or otherwise recovered, we can quickly identify its rightful owner. This greatly enhances our ability to recover a stolen bicycle and is well worth the nominal fee!

TIP: Always carry a locking device for your bike wherever you go. A little prevention goes a long way in protecting your property, and a locked-up bike is far less likely to be stolen.

ADULT SOFTBALL LEAGUES - The Winthrop Harbor Recreation Department is organizing two adult softball leagues, one Men's league and one Co-Ed league, with registration to begin on July 10th and continue through August 11th. The Co-Ed League games will be played on Monday and Wednesday nights from Aug. 21st through Oct. 18th. The Men's League games will be played on Tuesday and Thursday nights from Aug. 22nd through Oct. 19th.

A maximum of eight teams will be allowed in each league, with each team having a minimum of 9 players to a maximum of 16 players on the roster. Economic Development

At the May 2, 2006 Village Board meeting, Pat DiPersio was appointed as the Economic Development Coordinator for Winthrop Harbor. Pat has spent the past month setting up his office at Village Hall and familiarizing himself with the Village and our goals for the future. He is excited to play a role in the future economic success of the Village and wishes to thank the EDC, Village Board and residents for giving him this opportunity.

The Economic Development Coordinator position will have a primary responsibility of implementing the Village's economic development plans. This will be achieved by establishing an economic development program used to attract new business to the Village while at the same time supporting the efforts of our existing business base. A variety of initiatives will be considered during this process which is intended to produce a comprehensive and competitive development program for the Village.

In addition to filling the Development Coordinator position the EDC has continued its efforts to promote and support the local economy in a number of ways. The Committee initiated the sidewalk repaving project along Sheridan Road, managed the annual Sheridan Road Flower Pot program and was successful in securing \$144,800 in grant money to help pay for engineering costs associated with the 7th Street Streetscape Plan.

The Committee as well continues to play an active role in encouraging the completion of the planned Metra station expansion, the implementation of new business district zoning ordinances and in sourcing additional grant monies.

The EDC recognizes the significant challenge in growing the economy of the Village given budgetary constraints and the competitive environment in which we operate. It will require a cooperative effort from all stakeholders and our success will depend on taking advantage of our unique assets; the Marina, our location and our valued way of life. The Marina being the most marketable for its ability to attract visitors to the Village and also because it is State owned and therefore the State has a vested interest in ensuring that the Village thrives.

It has been 16 years since the Marina opened and unfortunately we have not seen the expected positive economic impact it promised. The Village, as a

gateway to Illinois, and Northpoint Marina, as a World class facility, should demand the full attention and support of the State. The EDC is committed to encouraging the State to continue its current investment and to increase its support in the future.

Monday Branch Pick-up Policy

The Winthrop Harbor Public Works Department provides a weekly brush pickup on Mondays. To facilitate timely pick-ups, the length of limbs and branches should be left as long as possible, as whole limbs chip up much better than small, cut-up pieces.

Please spread branches out evenly along the parkway, with cut ends facing the street. *Tangled piles of limbs or branches placed haphazardly will not be picked up.*

Residents are reminded that the Village does not remove debris left by tree trimming or lawn service contractors. Also, please remember that the Village will only be collecting trimmed branches, not entire tree removals. We also do not pick up lawn refuse, leaves, grass clippings, tree trunks, logs, etceteras.

To ensure that your branches are picked up, please contact Public Works on the Friday prior to the next scheduled pick up day. Call us at either 847-872-5275 or 847-872-3846 (ext. 248).

Mulch is available for pick up or delivery to any Village resident.

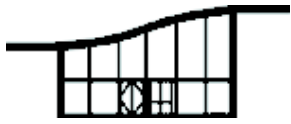
