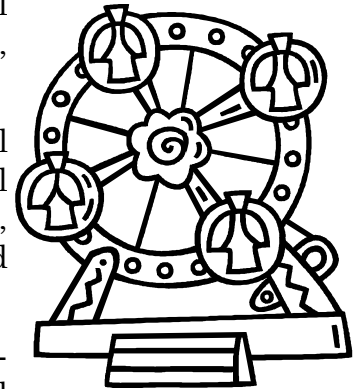

Big-H Amusements will have plenty of carnival rides for all ages, with an unlimited rides special of only \$16 per person on Thursday from 6-10pm, and again from 1-5pm on both Saturday and Sunday.



New this year, on Thursday, will be a pie-throwing event, where you can come out and throw a pie at your favorite (or least favorite) person! The food and beer booths will be open from 5-10pm.

Our food booth and the beer booth will be open 11am-11pm, and we'll have pony rides and candy scrambles throughout the day. At 9:30pm on Saturday there will be a fireworks show, don't miss it!

Recreation Programs

TEEN DANCE — May 9th will be the final Teen Dance of the 2007/08 school year. The Teen Dance is held from 7-10 pm at the Schlader Building. Students attending 5th-8th grades at Winthrop Harbor schools may attend, as well as students who live in Winthrop Harbor but attend alternative schools. All students must show their North Prairie school ID, or students attending alternative schools, including home schooled, or 5th graders attending Westfield, must obtain a photo dance ID from the Recreation Dept. The first ID issued is at no charge to the child, however any additional ID's needed will cost \$5. Admission is only \$2, and pizza & soda will be available for sale. Please note that the normal school dress code is strictly enforced, and once you've entered the dance you may only leave when it's over at 10pm, unless a parent comes to the door to pick you up earlier. The dances are organized by the Recreation Dept. and we're always looking for help with chaperones. If you would like to help, please call 847-746-3505.

ACTIVITY NIGHT FOR 3rd & 4th GRADERS

— Our last Activity Night of the school year is scheduled for **May 16th** from 7-9 pm at the Schlader Building. The building will be open to 3rd & 4th grade students who live in the Village of Winthrop Harbor. Activities scheduled for the evening will include music, various games (board games/card games), open gym, and refreshments to purchase. Admission is \$2 at the door, and no one who enters the building will be allowed to leave before 9pm, unless that child's parent comes to the door to pick them up. This is a Recreation Board sponsored event. We welcome any parent who would like to stay and chaperone. Call Recreation with questions at 847-746-3505.

BASEBALL/SOFTBALL 2008 — All teams, boys and girls, have been separated and are practicing as we speak. It will not be long until all of the diamonds will be filled with cheer and energy of the games to come. Games are tentatively scheduled to begin the week of May 12th for older kids, and the week of May 19th for the younger groups. All games will be played during the week, and every team will play at least two games each week. The night of games will all depend on the coach of the team, and what night they can work out. Once the games begin, there will be no regular practices, only games. All boys and girls teams ages 7+ will be playing against the neighboring communities of Zion, Beach Park and Waukegan. We expect to continue to add to the previous success of playing these towns as our kids meet new coaches and players, and participate against different teams while playing in new surroundings. Each age group will play each team once in the Harbor and once away in Zion or Beach Park. Good luck to all teams and remember to enjoy your time while playing this summer!

WALK'N WALK'N — Looking for a way to stay in shape without having to be outside? The Schlader Recreation Center will be open for walking from 8-10 am Mondays through Fridays through the end of May. The gymnasium is available for all who wish to participate, and there is no charge. Note that the building will be closed on most holidays.

SKATE PARK — The Winthrop Harbor skate park is now open for the summer. Pre-registration and a photo ID, issued by the Recreation Dept., is required for all skate park users. A parent must sign the registration form for users under 18. Costs are \$10 for residents and \$15 for non-residents. This one-time fee ensures use of the park until Nov. 1st when the park closes for the winter. The fees help maintain the ID system and the park and equipment.

MUNCHKIN PROGRAMS FOR AGES 3-8

— This summer the Recreation Dept. will have a new kid's program to offer boys and girls ages 3 to 8. They will be under instructors from the Mark Miller Munchkin programs.

These programs have been very successful and popular in the Chicagoland area, and have appeared on ABC, NBC, CBS, WGN, Bozo's Circus and CLTV. They were also featured nationally in Small Business and Home Based Business magazines, the Chicago Tribune and many local newspapers.

Beginning June 14th and continuing for 8 weeks until Aug. 9th, classes will be offered on Monday nights and Saturday afternoons.

Monday nights from 6-6:30pm will be "Parent and Me soccer" for ages 3 to 5. This program gives parents an opportunity to help teach their children the game of soccer. With guidelines from an instructor, parents will spend quality time with their children as they learn the basic skills, coordination drills and fun games, all in a relaxed and fun environment. From 6:30-7pm ages 4 to 8 will have their own version of the class, led by an instructor only. Class fees are \$85 per child for the entire 8 week period, June 16—Aug. 4.

Saturday afternoons will be "Parent and Me Wide World of Sports" for ages 3 to 5 from 2:30-3pm. At each class children will learn a different sport, including soccer, t-ball and basketball. This is a perfect way for children to learn a variety of activities. The classes will be fun and an excellent learning experience. Ages 4 to 8 will be 3-3:30pm, taught by an instructor. Class fees are \$85 per child for the entire 8 week period, June 14—Aug. 9.

SENIOR FREE-RIDE PROGRAM

Seniors age 65 or over are eligible for free transit on fixed routes operated by the Chicago Transit Authority (CTA), Metra & Pace. You will need the RTA Senior reduced fare card. You may register at the Township office, please call for an appointment and bring a photo ID. Processing takes 3 to 4 weeks after registration.

PACE DIAL-A-RIDE SERVICE

Pace Dial-A-Ride bus service is available for Benton Township residents. Service hours are Tuesday and Thursday from 8:30 am until 4 pm.

This service will take you anywhere in Benton, Newport and Zion Townships, as well as the Villages of Beach Park, Wadsworth, Winthrop Harbor and Gurnee. Cost is \$1.60 one-way for adults; 80 cents for seniors and children ages 7-11. To schedule a ride, call 800-201-6446 at least one day in advance.

FREE AMPLIFIED PHONES

Neither age nor income a requirement. Call 847-949-4440 for information.

FREE EMERGENCY CELL PHONES

For seniors and disabled citizens without a cell phone, the township office has free emergency cell phones available. The phones are programmed for calling 911 only. Residents who have an old cell phone to donate, please bring them to the Township office.

PRESCRIPTION DRUG CARDS

For those without prescription insurance available, stop by the Township office for a free drug card. Income/age not a factor.

Fire Department Safety Tips

Do you have a Fire-Safe Attitude?

Nothing puts a damper on your favorite summertime activity like a fire or an injury. WHFD urges you to follow these safety tips and to adopt a fire safe attitude so that your activities are remembered only for the fun!

MATCHES AND LIGHTERS: *Tools for grown-ups - not toys for kids!*

- Always keep matches and lighters out of the sight and reach of children. Discourage your children from picking them up and encourage them to tell an adult if found.

SMOKING MATERIALS: *Use the ashtray - not the roadway!*

During the summer months, WHFD experiences a sharp increase in brush fires that start from discarded cigarette butts tossed into roadside shrubbery or mulch.

- Extinguish and discard cigarette butts in an appropriate metal container or ashtray.

BARBECUE SAFETY: *Fire up the grill - not the patio!*

- Read the Owner's Manual prior to operating a gas grill.
- Open the lid while igniting gas barbecue burners or wait five (5) minutes to allow the gas to clear if the barbecue does not light. Flame-up may occur if you fail to do so.
- Never leave your barbecue unattended, especially when children are around. Always have a hose, bucket of water, or fire extinguisher nearby in case of fire.
- Keep clothing, towels, and hot pads away from flames. Use long-handled barbecuing utensils.
- Use charcoal lighter fluid sparingly and with caution. Never squirt "just a little more" once the fire is lit (even if it is just smoking) as the fire can shoot back up along the stream and explode the container in your face and hands.
- Always discard spent briquettes and warm ashes in a METAL can far away from combustibles (such as the deck or siding). Briquettes can stay hot and burn through paper bags or plastic buckets for hours after a fire is extinguished. It's safest to wait one full day before removing used briquettes from the barbecue.
- Store unused briquettes in a dry place away from potential ignition sources and combustible materials.
- At every change of propane tanks/bottles, check the fittings to ensure proper seal and fit.

GASOLINE SAFETY: *Fuel for equipment - not fuel for a fire!*

- Never smoke or strike a match or lighter while fueling a chain saw, garden tractor, lawnmower, and other gasoline engines. The invisible vapors are considered dangerous and explosive.
- When refueling your lawnmower or other gasoline-powered yard equipment, always turn off the engine to avoid stray sparks.
- Pour gasoline very carefully. If you spill gasoline, wipe it up immediately and let the saturated rag air out thoroughly.
- Keep gasoline in an approved container with a tight fitting lid to keep the vapors inside.
- Store gasoline containers out of the reach of children and away from potential ignition sources.

Never store or use gasoline in an enclosed area or in the presence of pilot lights.

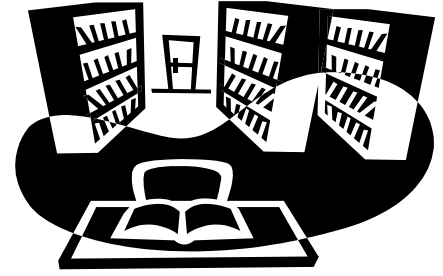
